




2025 Main Street Survey Results from the Public


Survey Background:

- The survey questions were created by Eatonton Main Street.
- The survey responses will assist the Eatonton Main Street Advisory Board in setting their priorities for 2026.
- The survey was distributed to the public via email and social media from December 15, 2025 through January 7, 2026.
- 288 responses were received during this time period.
 - 246 responses were received in 2024.
 - 235 responses were received in 2023.
 - 220 responses were received in 2022.
 - 196 responses were received in 2021.
 - 119 responses were received in 2020.


How long have you lived in Eatonton/Putnam County?






What days of the week do you typically go shopping?




What days of the week do you typically go out to eat?




How important is it to YOU to have a thriving downtown?




What is your general opinion of Downtown Eatonton?




Do you feel safe in Downtown Eatonton?

Fix road downtown around courthouse square.



Fewer empty storefronts/more businesses, although how you get folks to support the businesses is a huge question.



















Awnings for each building bright colorful each building has a different color, yellow blue green red. I saw this in Marietta. It was very nice and welcoming.


I like the hanging baskets, like the ones they have in Greensboro

We need a trolley to do tours and take people around town to these the history while stopping at the writers museum and Uncle Remus.


